

Mary B. Martin Visiting Artist **Joyce Ogden, Sculptor** Public lecture Wednesday March 2, Ball Hall Auditorium 7:00PM



Through her work, Indiana based artist **Joyce Ogden** explores the relationship of humans to nature, time and space. Her explorations and observations of soil, sap, sand, seed, pods and natural elements result in natural and telling artworks.

Ogden earned a MFA from the Henry Radford Hope School of Fine Arts at Indiana University, Bloomington and has exhibited throughout the south and midwest United States, including: the Speed Museum in Kentucky and Contemporary Art Center in Atlanta. She will talk on her process and will work with students.

Ogden has been the recipient of grants and awards that include the Joan Mitchell Foundation Painters and Sculptors Grant Program and Kentucky Foundation for Women Sallie Bingham Award. In addition, she is a founding member of ENID, a Louisville based women sculptors organization. Her work has been reviewed in regional and national publications. Ms. Ogden is currently Professor of Art at Spalding University and the Kentucky School of Art in Louisville, Kentucky.
